Panama City Beach, Florida

68 Students and 5 staff went to Panama City Beach for our traditional evangelism conference to reach out to the thousands of college students who head south for a week of partying on the beach. Our students were challenged, encouraged, and trained in how to share their faith more effectively. A number of students they met and talked with indicated



decisions for Christ. What excites us still more is how this experience propels students to continue to share their faith back home. Recently, I read an e-mail from one student who was thrilled about the results of a conversation about Jesus she had with her roommate upon returning from Florida.



Katrina Relief: New Orleans, Louisiana

Responding to the devastation from Katrina, **100+** students (including 20 from the Panama City Beach trip who drove the 5 hours to pitch in for a day) faced ravaged New Orleans.

Fitted with hammers, gloves, masks, and serving hearts, our students entered what they recounted as a war-torn, third-world country.

Inner-city Detroit, Michigan

18 people in our ministry set aside their Spring break week to enter one of America's most hurting urban cities.

The trip is called Urban Immersion and offers the students practical ways to serve and experience a variety of urban outreach ministries in Detroit's inner-city.

Service is not the only objective.

The Campus Crusade staff who direct this short-term intensive ministry also seek to remove misconceptions in the student participants and reshape their understanding of the inner-city and urban ministry. It must have worked to some degree, because students are saying their eyes were opened and their thinking changed. A fair portion of the individuals who participated in Urban Immersion conferences in previous years have later pursued opportunities to volunteer or work with similar ministries after they graduation.

Thank you for standing with us as we win, build, train, and send out students both for the short-term and long. Your partnership helps us mobilize energetic students who can help meet the needs of our country and world.
